An Open Meeting of the Board of Aldermen of the City of Shrewsbury, Missouri was held at 6:30 p.m. on March 10, 2020 in the Aldermanic Chambers of City Hall for the transaction of such business that came before the Board.

Roll Call

Mayor Scherer called the meeting to order, and Director Greever commenced with the roll call. A quorum was present for the transaction of city business.

Approval of Minutes

Mayor Scherer introduced the minutes from the February 25, 2020 Board Meeting and opened the floor for discussion. There being no discussion, Alderman Travaglini made a motion to approve the minutes; Alderman Lauter seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Approval of Bills – March 2020

Mayor Scherer introduced the bills for March and reviewed each of them. Upon no discussion, Alderman Travaglini made a motion to approve the bills and Alderman Odenwald seconded the motion.

Hear Citizens

Patrice & Joe Russo of 7222 Nottingham both addressed the board, sharing their concerns regarding the Allen Outdoor Solution (AOS) fence along the rear of their property, and expressed their desire to have the board find solutions that could work for the residents.

Anna Bischof of 7228 Nottingham also expressed her desire to find a solution that worked for the residents in the same matter, and wanted the residents to be heard, as well as for the board to address

the water drainage in the swale at the rear of the AOS property.

Erica Chicoineau of 7226 Nottingham addressed the board about the same matter and also expressed her concerns.

Stuart Pfeifer of 7230 Nottingham also expressed his displeasure with the situation and requested board action to find a solution for the fence matter.

James Collins of 7232 Nottingham also shared his displeasure with the same matter and also implored the board to find a solution that would work for the residents.

The Mayor told the residents that the city would look into the matter to see what could be done.

Liquor License Applications

The Mayor introduced the next topic, a set of liquor licenses for the St. Michael the Archangel, including the 2020 Picnic, the two soccer tournament licenses, and the Oktoberfest license. Alderman Odenwald made a motion to approve the license applications, and Alderman Reeves seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Police Purchase Request

Police Chief Vargas presented a radio purchase request for two radio units for \$4,320 from a sole provider company called Assisted Patrol, LLC. Alderman Travaglini made a motion to approve the purchase, seconded by Alderman Peters and unanimously approved.

Distracted Driving Ordinance

Mayor Scherer then introduced Bill Number 2995, which would authorize an ordinance regulating distracted driving in the City of Shrewsbury. Mayor Scherer and Director Greever provided a brief, general overview of the provisions of the ordinance, which helped clarify types of distracted driving for the benefit of the police officers, and after a motion by Alderman Travaglini, seconded by Alderman Lauter, and unanimously passed in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only the first time. Mayor Scherer opened the floor to any further discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderman Odenwald, seconded by Alderman Peters, and unanimously passed in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only for the second and final time. The Mayor opened the floor for final discussion. There being no discussion, Alderman Travaglini made a motion that Bill No. 2995 be adopted to become Ordinance No. 2982. Alderman Lauter seconded the motion and upon roll call, the following vote was recorded: Alderman Travaglini, "Aye"; Alderman Lauter, "Aye"; Alderman Peters, "Aye"; Alderman Odenwald, "Aye"; and Alderman Reeves, "Aye". There being unanimous votes in the affirmative, the Mayor declared that Bill Number 2995 was approved and was therefore adopted as Ordinance No. 2982.

Head and Mayoral Reports

The Department Heads all gave quick updates on various general matters in each of their departments and the Mayor briefly provided a quick citywide update.



Adjournment


Alderman Travaglini made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Alderman Lauter seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.
